



Nitti size comparison chart

Please note that this is an indicative comparison chart only. Everybody's feet are different and every manufacturer and every shoe style might have a different cut. Safety footwear has a different purpose and different build than i.e. sport shoes and one can therefore not assume one will have the same size.

It is recommended that you try on the shoes to ensure the optimal fit.

Shoe fitting tips:

- ▲ do the fitting at the end of the day when your feet are the most swollen.
- ▲ fit the shoes with the type of socks you'll wear them
- ▲ Try first on your largest foot (for most people this is the opposite foot that you write with)
- ▲ stand up with the shoes on and walk around, the shoes should feel comfortable and you should be able to wiggle your toes a bit.

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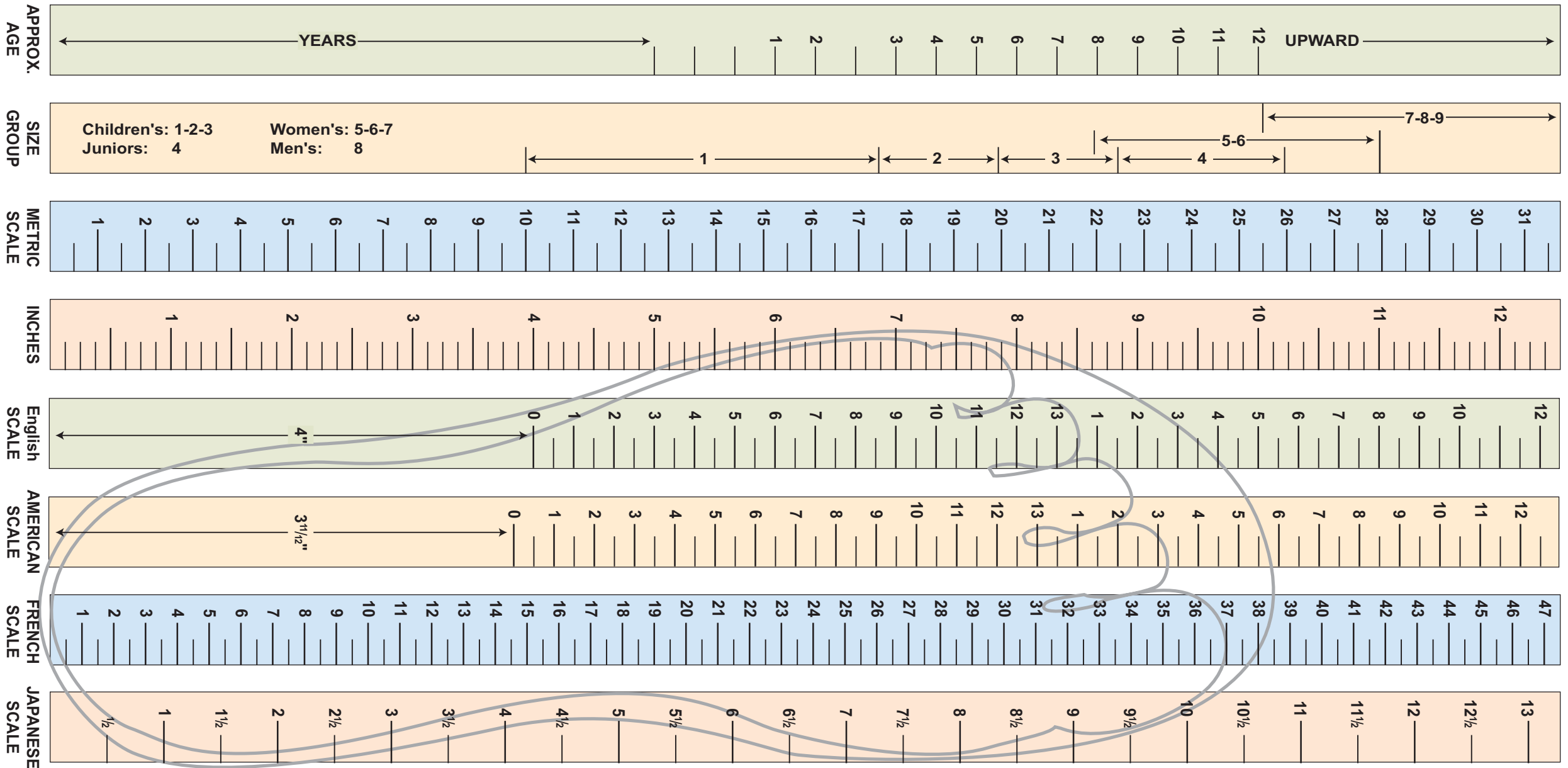

COMPARATIVE SIZE CHART

ENGLISH VERSUS AMERICAN SIZES: To convert an English Size to American, add 1½ sizes, thus size 4 is marked size 5½

1. Put heel against a ruler at the bottom of the chart
2. put pressure on the foot and see where the top of your toe ends
3. add 2 French sizes



SIZE GROUP:

Easy method of converting English sizes into French point. English size "5" adult's (10") is practically the same as 38 French point.

$$\text{French Points} = \frac{\text{Eng. sizes in inches} \times 38}{10}$$

METRIC SCALE:

This is another scale used in Europe with one size equal to 1 cm.

English SCALE:

Starts with Child's size "0" representing a shoe insole length of 4", each full size interval is 1/3", or 8.4mm. The English size scale is divided into (1) a Children's size ranging from "0" to "13" (4"-8 1/2") and (2) an Adult's scale ranging from "1" to "12" (8 2/3"-12 1/3"). Half sizes are usually made.

AMERICAN SCALE:

Starts with Child's size "0" representing a shoe insole length of 3 1/12", each size interval is 1/3" similar to the English size stick: each size is therefore 1/12" shorter than its English equivalent. Half sizes are made.

FRENCH SCALE:

This continental size unit is equal to 6.6mm. The size scale begins at 0cm. and continues without a break up to the largest sizes. Half sizes are generally not made.

JAPANESE SCALE:

Used exclusively by Japanese footwear export trade. Each size equals 24mm 1/4 and 1/2 sizes are made. Size 9 is equal to 8 1/2 inches.
